Aflatoun Children receive Social Education!

During the month of October, Aflatoun Children from Kampala-Wakiso were engaged in enormous social activities with Aflatoun Team. They were involved in club elections; they did social activities from the Aflatoun workbooks.

Children were able to see members of the Aflatoun Secretariat and other Aflatoun Partners in African Countries form a Photo Shot taken in the Aflatoun Regional Meeting in Kenya last year in November.

During the same time, Aflatoun children were able to learn the Aflatoun Motto, while others enjoyed the Power points showcasing what other Children in other Aflatoun Schools were doing in their clubs.

A total of 803 Aflatoun children [476 girls, 327 boys] in 13 Aflatoun schools in Kampala and Wakiso were reached with Social Education.

This motivated many and a sizeable number of club members decided to call meetings to discuss the different activities they can embark on this and next school year.

Aflatoun Club leaders and children receive Financial Education Training!

Over the month of October, PEDN Aflatoun team in Kampala took aflatoun children through their roles and responsibilities as club leaders, they were taught

A total of 15 Club leaders [8 girls, 7 boys] were trained in the saving process and record keeping. Children were able to learn the banking process and the importance engaging in a proper School bank system.

A total of 228 other Aflatoun children [119 girls, 109 boys] were trained in the same during this process.

Present during this training were Aflatoun School Liaison teachers who also expressed that the club leaders training helped them understand the School bank model more.

A total of 7 Aflatoun School Liaison teachers [3 males, 4 females] from 4 Aflatoun schools benefitted from this observation training.

A month of receiving in Aflatoun Schools!

During the month of October, PEDN Aflatoun Kampala-Wakiso team distributed Aflatoun Club materials to schools with schools receiving saving boxes and some padlocks.

A total of 14 saving boxes were delivered to 14 Aflatoun schools in Kampala and Wakiso.

Schools also received simple Aflatoun Children and Teacher kits with information materials to enable them administer the Aflatoun program in schools.

Railways Children School comes on Board!

After a successful Aflatoun pilot programme, we are now rolling out Aflatoun with learnings and tremendous experiences. The new Aflatoun stop over is at Railways Children school. A tremendous school overlooking the city Center, Railways presents the nature of school where Aflatoun will shine bright. Railways Children school harbors the heart of children from the proximal slums of Nsambya. Very unique about it is its inimitable family groups that provide safe haven for the slum children-teachers and children in the school have been startling relatives to children at School providing a family life they hitherto lacked at home.

The Aflatoun Kampala-Wakiso team visited the school 3 times this month and in true Aflatoun spirit explored the School, interacted with teachers and Children and pioneered the Aflatoun idea there.

To some people, behind every successful man there's a woman, and behind every successful NGO, there is a Treasurer. To PEDN that has been Mrs. Juliet Nazziwa Musoke. The distinct person who has perhaps signed more financial documents at PEDN than any other...Mrs. Juliet Musoke has had to weather reviewing and signing PEDN documents at weird hours, in weird places and at her comfortable functions and events to meet urgent needs at PEDN. To PEDN this left us wondering until we learnt this!

Juliet has a big passion for voluntary efforts that improve the lives of people, and that keeps her going. An icon of integrity, Juliet has seen PEDN grow from a small organisation into one that has won the hearts of philanthropists.

Juliet's exploits at PEDN are just a drop in the ocean if compared to what she has done in bountiful capacities.

During her reign at Uganda Women Entrepreneurs Association Limited-UWEAL, Juliet served in various capacities. She joined UWEAL as a member in 1997 and served as a Board member in 1999 -2001. During this period, UWEAL did not have a full time Executive Director, and Juliet volunteered time at the Secretariat.

Hundreds of women entrepreneurs we see today would not have made the grade had it not been for the liberal hands of Juliet. She was instrumental in uplifting the current image of UWEAL as a voice for women entrepreneurs at national level; extended UWEAL networks at local and international level, mobilized financial resources for various programs and increased UWEAL membership. Based on that, it's no wonder Juliet has fervor for Development issues – especially Entrepreneurship, women empowerment, business development service, Training, lobbying and advocacy.

Juliet transformed UWEAL from an average organisation to a pillar of women development in Uganda and across borders-strengthening and establishing systems at the Secretariat. By this, UWEAL's visibility as a champion of Women entrepreneurship and Business development grew. Its Juliet's hard work that made people Stop, Listen and Act for UWEAL. Because of her, UWEAL networks expanded to numerous revere companies, organizations and institutions at local and International level.

Juliet's hand of service has been felt by women almost everywhere she has worked. While at the Council for Economic Empowerment for Women in Africa-CEEWA (U), she passionately promoted the economic empowerment of women in Agriculture Enterprise Development, micro-finance and Entrepreneurship.

A lady of much expertise, Juliet has been a darling of success! As Acting Head of department and Lecturer in the Department of Human Resource and Development at Kyambogo University, Juliet was instrumental in the review and inclusion of Entrepreneurship and other courses in the Diploma and engineering programmes.

Its such know-how that has won her dear vocation as a supervisor, researcher and administrator with credible and robust companies and institutions in Uganda and at international level that are better off not mentioned for concerns of space.

A graduate of Makerere University, Juliet holds a Master of Arts degree from the University of New South Wales, Australia, and has key qualifications in Good Governance Principles, SMEs, Entrepreneurship training, Business Development Services (BDS), Business Counseling & Extension and Financial management for Non-Financial Managers.

Juliet is currently the Executive Director of Uganda Flowers Exporters Association – UFEA and is continuing her serial achievements there. In a space of only one year, Juliet has regularized the UFEA system and structures-reducing financial liabilities of the association, coordinating training of Board members and members in good governance principles, and improving publicity and relation with the UNIONS, and has lobbied and advocated for industry specific incentives, and obtained funding.
